## Fruit Tree Descriptions

Listed below are many of the most popular varieties of fruit trees that we try to stock. Unfortunately, the availability of these varieties will vary from season to season, and from year to year. Please call to check on the current availability of the varieties you are interested in.

### Almond Trees

Almond trees have a similar shape as a large peach tree. Spray for peach borer and husk fly just like peach trees. Almonds need ideal conditions for best flavor. Hardy varieties are not as sweet as soft shell varieties. Soft shell varieties are subject to winter injury.

**Almond 'All In One'** Medium to large nut. Self fertile. Semi-hard shelled variety. Flavor not as sweet as other, less hardy, varieties. Good pollinator. Very hardy variety for this area.

Height 15 to 20 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Almond 'Hall's Hardy'** Very cold hardy tree. Quality kernels. Taste not as flavorful compared to other (less hardy) varieties. Good variety for cold climates. Self fertile. Semi-hard shelled.

Height 15 to 20 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Almond 'Ne Plus Ultra'** Long, narrow, sweet kernels. Soft shelled variety. Needs a pollinizer. Hardy to -5 degrees. Good flavor; influenced by fertilizer and water. Not extremely winter hardy.

Height 15 to 25 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Almond 'Nonpareil'** Long, narrow, sweet kernels. Thin shell variety. Needs a pollinizer. Hardy to -5 degrees. Somewhat hardy.

Height 15 to 20 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

### Apple Trees

Apple trees may take three to seven years to start blooming. To keep apples "Worm Free" spray regularly with a 'Fruit Tree Spray'. Start spraying 3 weeks after blossoms drop. Spray every 10 to 14 days until September. **Ripening Order:** Lodi, Gravenstein, Gala, Jonathan, McIntosh, Red Delicious, Yellow Delicious, Rome, Mutsu, Winesap, Fuji, Pink Lady, Braeburn, Granny Smith.

**Apple 'Braeburn'** Medium sized greenish-red apples. Crisp yet sweet flavor. Firm fruit. Ripens mid to late October. May not always ripen before an early frost. Stores well. Flavor similar to Granny Smith but more flavorful.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Apple 'Columnar'** Very narrow, columnar tree. Grows 7 to 10 feet tall. Spreads 2 to 3 feet wide. Perfect for patios or small space gardens. Produces full sized apples with a good flavor. Very productive for a small tree.

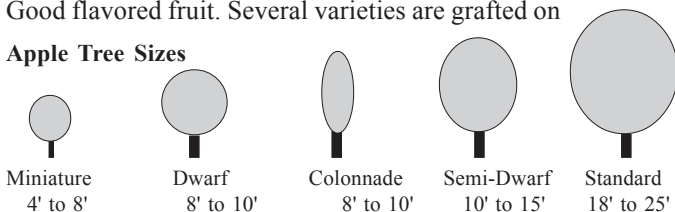
**'Columnar Northpole'** Large, red, 'McIntosh-type' apple.

Crisp, Juicy and aromatic fruit. Needs a pollinator.

**'Columnar Scarlet Sentinel'** Large, red-blushed, greenish-yellow apple. Delicious flavor.

**Apple 'Combination'** - Full sized apples on semi dwarf trees. Good flavored fruit. Several varieties are grafted on

each tree, see each tree tag for varieties. It produces a small to medium crop of fruit. Fun to grow with several different colors and types of apples on each tree to choose from.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 15' Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Apple 'Espaliered'** Regular sized apples on an espaliered tree. Good flavored fruit. Fruit ripens normally and with same taste as on regular trees. You can shape the tree to grow along a fence or by a house. Great for small areas. Several different varieties are available.

Height 4 to 10 feet Spread 4 to 10 feet. You control size.

**Apple 'Fuji'** Large, crisp apple with green and red stripes, stores well. Very flavorful. Ripens late-October. Fruit may not always ripen before an early frost. Stores well. Self pollinating.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Apple 'Gala'** Reddish-orange striped, juicy apple. Ripens early October. Crisp, semi-sweet apple-stores well. Pollinizer helps but is not necessary. One of the best flavored apple varieties.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apple 'Garden Delicious'** Does well in containers. Sweet, greenish-yellow apples in early fall - self fertile genetic dwarf tree.

Miniature Height 6 to 8 feet Spread 4 to 8 feet.

**Apple 'Granny Smith'** Green, tasty apples. Great tart flavor for eating fresh or juicing. Needs a long growing season. Ripens in late October. Harvest before frost. Stores well. Self fruitful.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet - Spread 10 to 18 feet

**Apple 'Gravenstein'** Large, red-striped apples. Great tart flavor for eating fresh or juicing. Old-time favorite 'cooking apple'. Ripens early-September.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet - Spread 10 to 18 feet

**Apple 'Jonagold'** Cross between Jonathan and Golden Delicious. Juicy, yellow apple blushed with red. Ripens in mid-October. Sweet, tart flavor. - needs pollinizer.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Apple 'Jonalicious'** Very sweet, red Jonathan apple variety. Ripens in mid-October. Good fresh, juiced, or in pies. Stores well. One of the best Jonathan varieties.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Apple 'Jonathan'** Red skinned apples. Ripen in mid October. White juicy flesh. Medium sized fruit - Sweet, crisp, but tart enough for cooking and juicing. Stores well. Prone to mildew.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet

**Apple 'Lodi'** Tart, yellow, crisp apples. Ripens in mid July. Pick before completely ripens. Eat fresh or cooked as applesauce, doesn't store well. 'Improved Yellow Transparent Apple'.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apple 'Mc Intosh'** Large, round, red, crisp apple. Ripens in October. Excellent flavor fresh or for cooking. An excellent alternate to Red Delicious. Needs pollinator

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Apple 'Mutsu'** 'Golden delicious' type apple. Large, firm, juicy apple. Harvest while still green or slightly yellow. Excellent for dessert or processing. Needs pollinator.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet - Spread 10 to 18 feet

**Apple 'Pink Lady'** Very crisp, sweet-tart flavor. Reddish pink skin over green. Distinctive flavor. Medium size fruit. Stores well. Self pollinating.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet - Spread 10 to 18 feet

**Apple 'Red Delicious'** Juicy, red, sweet apples. Ripens in mid-October. Most popular apple grown. Pollenizer helps increase production. Many cultivars available. Does not store well.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apple 'Rome Beauty'** Large, round apple. Red skin with sweet-tart white flesh. Excellent for baking, very tart fresh. Very hardy tree. Stores well.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet. Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apple 'Yellow Delicious' - Golden Delicious** Golden-yellow skin with white flesh. Very sweet apple. Ripens in mid-October. Very good fruit for sauce, juice, or fresh off the tree. Good pollinator for other trees. Fruit doesn't store very long.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 20' Spread 8 to 12 feet.

## Apricot Trees

Treat Apricots for [Coryneum Blight -Shot Hole Fungus](#) - after leaves drop in the fall. Treat for [Peach Tree Borer](#) from mid-July to September. Thin fruit if frost doesn't do it for you. **Ripening order:** Early Glow, Chinese, Perfection, Moorpark, Tilton.

**Aprium 'Flavor Delight'** Apricot-Plum Hybrid. Resembles an apricot but has a distinctive flavor and texture all its own. Produces best if pollinated with another apricot. Ripens in July.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apricot 'Canadian White Blenheim'** Syrupy-sweet, white-flesh apricot. Firm texture. Produces best with pollinator. Excellent flavor. This is a fun, different fruit for the yard.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apricot 'Chinese sweet pit'** Blushed orange, juicy apricots. Ripens in July. Blooms over a long time, somewhat frost resistant. Medium, sweet fruit. Sweet pits. Most popular in this area.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apricot 'Early Glow - Sun Glo'** Very sweet medium, yellow-orange apricots. Ripens in July. Excellent flavored apricot. Medium sized fruit. Good fresh and bottled.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Apricot 'Tilton'** Golden-yellow, with a dark red blush. Firm apricots, one of the leading commercial varieties for drying and canning. Ripens in July. Small to medium, sweet fruit.

Semi dwarf Height 15 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Apricot 'Wenatchee Moorpark'** Yellow orange, tasty apricots in July. Large fruit - great for juice or leather. Does not bottle well. Needs pollenizer.

Semi dwarf Height 15 to 18 feet - Spread 10 to 18 feet.

## Cherry Trees

To keep cherries "Worm Free", [spray](#) when cherries start to turn from yellow to pink, usually mid-June. [Spray regularly until harvest.](#) [Ask for a Free "Wormy Cherry" Spray guide for more information.](#)

**Cherry 'Combination'** Excellent tree for small yards. Cherries ripen at their normal time and they are their normal size and color. Several varieties are grafted on one tree. See tag on each tree for varieties. Its fun to see green, white or red fruit all on one tree.

Semi dwarf Height 18 to 25 feet Spread 15 to 20 feet.

**Cherry 'Bing'** Dark red juicy cherries. Ripens in mid July. Needs pollenizer such as Van. - Great fresh, canned or frozen. Solid meaty fruit. Most popular variety.

Semi dwarf Height 15 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

**Cherry 'Lambert'** Firm, dark red sweet cherries. Ripens in mid July. Needs pollenizer such as Van. Hardy vigorous, productive. Juicy fruit. Ripens 2 weeks after bing.

Semi dwarf Height 18 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

**Cherry 'Lapins'** large, split-resistant fruit. Self fertile. Sometimes known as 'Self Fertile Bing'. Self pollinating.

Semi dwarf Height 18 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

**Cherry 'Montmorency'** Small, bright red, tart cherries. Ripens in mid July. Self fertile. Red skin with yellow flesh. Great for pies.

Semi dwarf Height 15 to 20 feet Spread 15 to 20 feet.

**Cherry 'Rainier'** Yellow, sweet cherries, similar to Royal Ann. Ripens in mid July. Needs pollenizer such as Van. Good fresh, canned or frozen.

Semi dwarf Height 18 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

**Cherry 'Royal Ann'** Yellow, sweet cherries. Ripens in mid July. Needs pollenizer such as Van. Good fresh, canned or frozen.

Semi dwarf Height 18 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

**Cherry 'Stella'** Large, nearly black, sweet cherries. Similar to Lambert. Ripens in mid July. Hardy tree. Self pollinating.

Semi dwarf Height 18 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

**Cherry 'Utah Giant'** Large, red, sweet cherries. Similar to Bing. Ripens in mid July. Hardy tree. Needs pollenizer such as Van.

Semi dwarf Height 18 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

**Cherry 'Van'** Firm, medium-sized, red sweet cherries, similar to Bing. Ripens in July. This variety needs a pollenizer such as Bing or Lambert and it is a great pollinator for all other cherries.

Semi dwarf Height 20 to 25 feet Spread 20 to 25 feet.

## Fig Trees

[Fig trees will grow in this area if you can get them through the first winter. They need a hot area and plenty of winter protection. Mulch them in late fall. Figs may produce two crops in one season if the old wood survives the winter, and if you do not trim the tree too severely. Trees may not produce fruit if winter injury is too severe.](#)

**Fig 'Brown Turkey'** Small tree. Brownish-purple fruit. Can grow 8 to 10 feet tall and spread 5 to 10 feet wide if the winter does not kill the branches..

**Fig 'Black Mission'** Purple-black fruit. Good flavor. Very popular in most areas. Can grow 10 to 15 feet tall and spread 10 to 12 feet wide if the winter does not kill the branches.

## Filbert Trees

[Filberts, commonly called hazelnuts, are one of the easiest nuts to grow. They are very hardy and need very little care. Plant two varieties for pollination - You can plant them in the same hole. Grow them as a tree or as a shrub. A ten year old tree can produce ten pounds of nuts.](#)

**Filbert 'Barcelona'** Good flavored, large sized filberts in late fall. Small tree or large shrub depending how it is trimmed. Needs pollinator. Very cold hardy tree. The best variety to plant.

Height 12 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Filbert 'Casina'** Small to medium filberts in late fall. Needs pollinator so plant 2 different varieties. Small tree or large shrub, depending on how it is pruned. Very hardy tree.

Height 10 to 12 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

**Filbert 'Daviana'** Good flavored, medium sized filberts in fall. Small tree or large shrub. Excellent pollinator but produces a light crop of nuts. Good variety to plant with Barcelona.

Height 12 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

**Filbert 'Du Chilly'** Good flavored, medium to large sized filberts in fall. Small tree or large shrub. Needs pollinator so plant 2 different varieties. Nuts are slow to drop, adheres to husks.

Height 12 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

**Filbert 'Royal'** Good flavored, large filberts in fall. Slow growing, small tree or large shrub. Needs pollinator. Plant 2 different varieties. You can plant 2 trees in the same hole if space is limited.

Height 12 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

## Nectarine Trees

Prune and fertilize Nectarine trees just like peaches. Treat for Peach Tree Borer from mid-July to September. Fruit has the 'peach flavor' without the 'Fuzz'. Excellent fresh, frozen, or canned. To prevent scars on skin, spray to control the 'Cat Facing' or 'Lygus' bug as soon as blossoms drop. Repeat sprays as recommended.

**Nectarine 'Flavortop'** Firm, yellow freestone fruit. Extremely sweet flavor. Ripens early.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 15' Spread 8 to 12 feet

**Nectarine 'Harko'** Sweet, firm, yellow fruit. Semi-freestone. One of the best flavored nectarines. Ripens early. Very hardy.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 15' Spread 8 to 12 feet

**Nectarine 'Red Gold'** Glossy red, firm nectarine. Ripens in early September. Large, sweet nectarine with golden orange flesh. Mostly freestone.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 15' Spread 8 to 12 feet

**Nectarine 'Sunglo'** Yellow fleshed nectarine with red skin. Ripens in late August. Very sweet, mostly freestone fruit.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 15 feet Spread 10 to 12 feet.

## Peach Trees

Peaches are one of the easiest trees to grow. Remove 99% of the fruit for the first 3 years. Prune trees heavily every year to prevent breakage. Thin excessive peaches in June to help increase fruit size and to improve flavor. Treat for Peach Tree Borer mid-July through September. Treat for Coryneum Blight after leaves drop in the fall. **Ripening Order:** Early Redhaven, Redhaven, Suncrest, Gleason Elberta, Halehaven, Golden Jubilee, Elberta, J.H. Hale, Rio Oso Gem.

**Peach 'Bonanza II'** Does well in containers, if protected in winter. Medium sized golden orange fruit. Very sweet, medium to small peach. Does not produce many peaches. Fun, decorative tree for patio areas.

Height 3 to 5 feet Spread 2 to 4 feet.

**Peach 'Early Redhaven'** Fruit is very similar to Red Haven. Ripens late-July, 7 to 14 days earlier than Red Haven. One of the first peaches to ripen. Semi-freestone peach. Good fresh or bottled. Excellent flavor.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 9 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'Elberta'** Large golden orange peach. Ripens in mid September. Freestone peach. Good fresh or bottled. The most popular variety. All peaches are compared to this variety for ripening time, size, and flavor.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 9 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'Gleason Early Elberta' Often called Lemon Elberta.** Juicy, rich flavored fruit. Ripens in mid September. Self fruitful - frost hardy - freestone. It is the most popular peach both fresh and canned. Golden yellow-orange skin with golden flesh. Most other peaches are compared to this variety.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 9 feet - Spread 8 to 12 feet

**Peach 'Golden Jubilee'** Golden yellow juicy peaches in early September. Medium to large freestone - very sweet and tasty. Doesn't bottle well, but excellent fresh off the tree.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 10 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'Hale Haven'** Firm, yellow peaches. Cross between JH Hale and Redhaven. Ripens in mid September. Medium to large peach - freestone. Good fresh or bottled. Has many Hale traits.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 10 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'Indian Free'** Large, firm, freestone peach. Crimson and cream colored flesh. Tart until fully ripe then extremely sweet, distinctive flavor. One of the best flavored peach. Needs pollinizer.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 10 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'J.H. Hale'** Blushed-gold flesh, with red color near the pit. Tasty, freestone fruit. Ripens in late September. Needs pollinizer. Large, firm fruit. Excellent Hale flavored peach.

Semi dwarf Height 8 to 12 feet Spread 10 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'July Elberta'** Yellow peaches. Ripens in mid September. Medium sized, freestone peach. Self pollinating.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 10 feet Spread 10 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'Polly'** Medium size, white-fleshed peach. Crimson-blushed, white skin. Freestone peach. Good fresh eating peach. Extremely winter hardy. Very sweet flavor.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 9 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'Redglobe'** Medium size, golden-yellow peach. Very attractive skin color. Ripens in late August. Freestone peach. Good fresh, bottled, or frozen.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 9 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

**Peach 'Redhaven'** Red skinned, juicy peaches. Ripens in mid to late August. One of the first peaches to ripen. Medium size, yellow fleshed semi-freestone fruit. Good fresh or bottled.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 10 feet Spread 10 to 12 feet

**Peach 'Reliance'** Large, sweet, yellow peach. Freestone. Ripens in early September. Excellent for freezing or eating fresh. Very cold hardy.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 10' Spread 8 to 10 feet.

**Peach 'Rio Oso Gem'** Large, sweet, yellow peach. Freestone. Ripens in late September. Excellent for freezing or eating fresh. Fairly small tree.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 10' Spread 6 to 8 feet.

**Peach 'Suncrest'** Large, round, yellow peach. Red blush covers much of fruit skin. Ripens in early-September. Freestone peach. Good fresh or bottled.

Semi dwarf Height 6 to 9 feet Spread 8 to 12 feet.

## Pear Trees

To keep pears "Worm Free" spray them similar to apples. Don't spray during the heat of the day to prevent russetting on the fruit. Dormant spray is especially important to prevent insects and diseases in pear trees. Watch for Fire Blight if rainy during in blossom period.

**Pear 'Anjou'** Creamy green flavorful pears. Ripens in November. Pick in October and store until ripe. Excellent winter pear. Stores well. Needs pollinizer.

Semi dwarf height 10 to 18 feet Spread 5 to 10 feet.

**Pear 'Bartlett'** Juicy, yellow, fragrant pears. This is the most popular bottling variety. Ripens late September. Harvest before pears drop and store until ripe. Self pollinating but planting 2 varieties helps increase production.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 5 to 10 feet.

**Pear 'Comice'** Large, roundish pear with thick skin. Russeted, greenish-yellow skin. Superb texture and flavor. Ripens best during cold storage. All pears produce better with pollinator.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 5 to 10 feet.

**Pear 'Kieffer'** Greenish color with red blush. Gritty texture with good flavor. Ripens in fall, harvest before they drop and store until ripe. Needs pollinizer. Stores well - good cooked or canned.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 5 to 10 feet.

**Pear 'Red Anjou'** Green pear with reddish blush. Harvest in October and store until pears ripen in December. Excellent flavor fresh. Does not bottle well. Larger crop with pollinator.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 15 feet. Spread 12 to 15 feet

**Pear 'Red Sensation'** Similar shape and flavor as Bartlett. Red blushed skin. Medium size tree, not as hardy as Bartlett. Pick green and let ripen. Bottles well. Produces better with pollinator.

Semi dwarf Height 12 to 15 feet. Spread 12 to 15 feet

## Asian Pear

To keep Asian pears "Worm Free" spray them like pears. They have a round shape and are crisp, just like an apple. They have a juicy flavor just like a pear. However, they are not a cross between an apple and a pear. Plant two different varieties to pollinize each other. Bartlett, and other summer pears, will also pollinate these trees.

**Asian Pear '20th Century' (Nijisseiki)** Yellow-green, crisp pear. Ripens in late-September. Apple shape with juicy pear flavor.

Height 10 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

**Asian Pear 'Chojuro'** Russeted Yellow-green crisp pear in fall. Apple shape with good pear flavor.

Height 10 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

**Asian Pear 'Hosui - Kosui'** Orange to Yellowish-green, crisp pear. Ripens in mid-September, 7 days before 20th Century. Apple shape with juicy pear flavor. One of the best flavored.

Height 10 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

**Asian Pear 'Shinseiki'** Bright Yellow-green crisp pear. Ripens in September. Apple shape with sweet pear flavor. Stores well in refrigerator.

Height 10 to 15 feet Spread 8 to 10 feet.

## Plum Trees

Plant two different varieties as a pollinizer to increase production. You can plant two or three different plum trees in one hole if you don't have room for a pollinator. Spray with Dormant Spray, before trees bloom to help prevent aphid damage. Spray again, with an insecticide, as soon as leaves form and after blossoms drop to kill aphids.

**Plum 'Flavor King'** Plum-apricot hybrid. Remarkable, spicy flavor. Reddish-purple skin with sweet, red flesh. A different flavor than standard plums. Needs a pollinator.

Semi Dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Plum 'Dapple Dandy'** Plum-apricot hybrid. Greenish-yellow skin with red spots. Skin turns maroon when ripe. Creamy-white and red flesh. Very sweet flavor. Needs a pollinator.

Semi Dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Plum 'Geo Pride'** Plum-apricot hybrid. Red skin with yellow flesh. Medium size fruit. Heavy producer. Needs a pollinator.

Semi Dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Plum-Cot 'Flavorella'** Plum-apricot hybrid. Medium size fruit with golden-yellow color. Unique, plum flavor. Ripens in July. Needs a pollinator.

Semi Dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Plum 'Combination'** Plums ripen at their normal schedule. Several varieties are grafted on one tree, see the tree tag for varieties. Great for small yards and for a few plums of several different varieties. Trim and shape tree to help keep all varieties vigorous. An alternative to planting several different trees.

Semi Dwarf Height 12 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 15 feet.

**Plum 'Elephant Heart'** Flavorful, red, juicy plums. Ripens in September. Large, sweet fruit with tart skin. Needs pollinator for maximum production. Thinning helps increase fruit size.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18' Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Plum 'Green Gage'** Medium, sweet, greenish-yellow plums. Ripens in late-August. Self fertile. Old variety but still favorite for eating fresh, cooked, or canned.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18' Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Plum 'Santa Rosa'** Reddish skinned, tasty plums. Ripens in September. Large, round fruit with amber-yellow flesh. Self fertile and good pollinizer. Tart skin with excellent flavored fruit. One of the best for home yards. Thin to increase flavor and size.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18' Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Plum 'Satsuma'** Sweet, reddish-purple, juicy plums. The most popular variety because of color and flavor. Ripens early September. Medium sized purple plum, very sweet. Needs pollinizer. Good for purple colored jam. Thinning helps improve size.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

## Prune Trees

Prune trees are easy to grow. The fruit dries easily and they are good for the digestive system. They are all self fertile.

**Prune 'Italian'** Purplish-blue, sweet prune. Ripens in early October. Large blue skin with amber flesh. Dries well. Great flavor fresh off the tree.

Semi dwarf Height 10 to 18 feet Spread 10 to 18 feet.

**Prune 'Stanley'** Dark blue sweet prunes. Ripens in late September. Large blue skin with greenish-yellow flesh. Very productive - self fertile - very hardy.

Semi dwarf Height 15 to 20 feet Spread 15 to 20 feet.

## Walnut and Pecan Trees

Walnut trees grow large. They do not like pruning. They can take 7 to 10 years to start bearing fruit, longer if pruned incorrectly. English Walnuts need a Black Walnut tree in the area for pollination to produce the maximum yield of fruit, otherwise you will get a smaller yield, which is still plenty of nuts. Treat for Walnut Husk Fly in August.

**Walnut 'Carpathian English'** Medium size walnuts in fall. Somewhat soft shelled nuts. Good shade tree. Tolerates both cold and heat. May take 7 years to produce nuts. Needs a pollinator for maximum production. Do not compost walnut leaves.

Height 40 to 60 feet Spread 30 to 40 feet.

**Walnut 'Manregion English'** Medium size walnuts in fall. Somewhat soft shelled nuts. Good shade tree. Tolerates both cold and heat. May take 7 years to produce nuts. Needs a pollinator for maximum production. Do not use walnut leaves in gardens.

Height 40 to 60 feet Spread 30 to 40 feet.

**Walnut 'Thomas Black'** Hard shell, black walnut. Ripens in late fall. Hard shell but has a rich flavor. Tree roots and leaves inhibit plant growth nearby. Self fertile. Good pollinator for other var.

Height 40 to 60 feet Spread 25 to 30 feet.

**Pecan 'Greenriver'** Northern variety. Long shelled nuts. Partially self-fruitful, produces a larger crop with a pollinator. Not extremely hardy but will usually survive in this climate. Pecans can take up to 20 years to bear fruit. Trees are very hard to transplant and start growing. Be patient.

Height 40 to 60 feet Spread 25 to 30 feet.

## Plant Several Trees In One Hole

Today, homes have less space for fruit trees. If you want to grow your own 'tree-ripe fruit' in your small yard, you can accomplish this by planting two, three, or even four different varieties of the same type of fruit tree; all in the same hole.
